
Recognition

Recognition

For All the chapters who apply for recognition, we want to thank you for your hard work, dedication, and determination to help better your community!

Recognition for the state community service project is determined by the cumulative hours of volunteer efforts. Listed below you can find the specific requirements needed to receive each level of honor

- Bronze: 15-25 hours, 30% of member involvement
- Silver: 25-40 hours, 50% of member involvement
- Gold: 40-50 hours, 70% of member involvement
- Platinum: 50+ hours, 90% of member involvement
